

Frequently Asked Questions

Q. Will the marriage be recognized in the US or any European Country?

A. Yes the marriage will be recognized in the US; the Virgin Islands are a part of the United States and is fully recognized and protected under the United States flag. For European Countries and Canadian Countries, an apostille may be required and we will be happy to assist you with this type of service.

Q. Can we request a Non-Denomination or an Ordained Minister?

A. Yes, you will have a choice of an Ordained Minister or a Non-Denominational.

Q. Why book with your wedding company?

Q. Will the Minister/Officiate be a male or female?

A. You can request a male or a female Minister/ Officiate to perform your ceremony.

Q. On the morning of the wedding where will the coordinator meet us?

Q. Are we required to have witnesses?

Q. If we were married before, will we need to provide a certified divorce decree and will we be able to get it back from the court?

A. Any one that has been married before must provide the Superior Court of the Virgin Islands a certified copy of the Divorce Decree. It must be an original copy with a raise seal or stamp with the judges stamp on it. Divorce Decrees from vital statistics is not allowed.
